MEMBER SPOTLIGHT Cariboo Chilcotin Gymnastics Association



The Cariboo Chilcotin Gymnastics Association started in 1978 and is a non-profit organization run by a board of directors. Currently, we have 14 volunteer board members.

The gymnastics club provides gymnastics programming for children, from crawling and up. All coaches have multiple levels in training certification. Programs offered for girls and boys include Parent and Tot; Mini 3-Year-Olds; Super 4-Year-Olds; Mighty 5-Year-Olds; Can Gym Level 1-12 for ages 6 and up; Teen Gym; Parkour; and Competitive. We have approximately five hundred registered athletes each season.

In addition to our regular programs, the club offers birthday parties, field trips and group bookings at the facility.

The club is a non-profit organization and relies heavily on the generosity of community members. We welcome donations from individuals, local businesses, and organizations.

This season, we wish to see our facility full of happy, healthy athletes of all ages and walks of life,

learning and experiencing life skills throughout the sports of gymnastics and parkour. We wish to allow all children to express themselves freely and feel like a part of our gymnastics family. We hope to allow all children in our community to have the opportunity to move and to be active safely, regardless of gender or ability.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT Cariboo Orthotics



Meet Alicia, the owner of Cariboo Orthotics. Alicia is one of two of our local Pedorthists servicing the Cariboo and Chilcotin regions. What is a Ped-or-thist you might wonder? A Pedorthist is a clinician within the "foot expert" realm, with some differences from the career of Podiatric Medicine (DPM). A Pedorthist will have a Bachelor of Health Sciences (or Kinesiology) degree AND 1-2 years of post-graduate schooling on orthotics, footwear, foot conditions etc. A Pedorthist will typically have more training on bracing and splinting and sports medicine rehab devices than a Podiatrist but are generally unable to do the skin and nail treatments & prescribing that a Podiatrist can do. If you have foot pain and live in the Cariboo/Chilcotin - seeking out an initial assessment with Alicia or Olivia (our local Pedorthists) is a wise first step. They can advise whether a trip to a DPM is worth your time and money and give various treatment options to try. Treatment plans often include products that can help rehab your condition, stretches and exercise suggestions and they can also cast for and order custom devices like orthotics, braces, and shoes.

What sets Cariboo Orthotics apart from other orthotics/bracing/compression garment experiences? Check out the Cariboo Orthotics google reviews and you will quickly understand - these ladies truly care about you, they listen, they work with you, and they educate you so that your goals can be achieved. Whether you see them with a prescription or referral in hand, or just to learn more about your feet/gait/knee/ankle conditions - they are happy to help.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT Casey Bennett Photography and Design



Casey Bennett started his photography journey in 2005 here in Williams Lake. Equipped with a used Nikon F90, several rolls of now discontinued Kodak black and white C-41 film and a desire to learn, he found himself roaming through the sweaty crowds of angsty concert-goers at Walt's Cafe on Oliver Street. For a brief, beautiful period, the now defunct cafe was host to several small indie concerts throughout the years. In that time, Casey made connections with several of the bands by taking their photos and sending them copies for their Myspace pages. Several of these bands were from Victoria and Vancouver. It was through these interactions, Casey decided he would leave Williams Lake and seek out bigger opportunities on the island.

In Victoria, Casey continued to focus on his love for concert photography and even became part of a local collective of photographers simply known as the Rocktographers. They photographed concerts big and small. A punk show in the basement of the Salvation Army one night and into the pit of a pyrotechnic light extravaganza at the arena the next. It was through this archaic style of photography that Casey learned how to think on his toes and capture the spontaneously wild nature of a concert. It wasn't very long until he was asked to photograph a wedding. A couple had stumbled across his Myspace, loved the black and white imagery of tatted up punks thrashing about. They booked him.

Throughout his years on the island, Casey found himself working as a freelancer; shooting campaigns for software companies, shopping malls and of course, musicians. On the side, he had secured a job with the University of Victoria, cataloging through their archives, photographing campus life and covering convocation. In 2014, Casey decided to take a step back from photography and enroll for graphic design courses in Vancouver. A year later, he was making the move from the island to the big city.

Fast forward, Casey has been slowly growing his

graphic design business here in Williams Lake. Upon returning to the Lake City in 2016, he's been working with several local non-profits and small businesses to help them by designing their logos, brochures, business cards and a couple of websites. His photography has been more focused on personal projects that interest him artistically. He's since invested back into shooting film, using a 4x5 and medium format camera to make his photographs and develop his own film at home. Over the past two years, he's even released two popular zines - one self published and the other published by a popular UK based publisher. However, he is opening his services up again for portraits, corporate headshots, and anything essential to his clients needs.

Being a creative is not just about designing something 'cool' for his clients, but it's a challenge to help solve their problems and design content that will generate attraction to their business as well as their needs. A good design can convey an attitude, a message and become a personal signature that is recognized everywhere. With that, Casey insists on building a trustworthy relationship with the client and creates an environment where they become part of the collaborative process. The more he's able to bring their voice and personality into the project, the more accurate the design becomes – the same for his photography. It's always been about creating a relaxed atmosphere. That's where creativity thrives.

When he's not working on photography or design, you can catch him kayaking on one of the several beautiful lakes in the region or reading a good book.

Dear Friends,

With 2022 almost in the books, we can all look forward to a Christmas season filled with family and friends. As the House of Commons winds down I have been reflecting on the past year. 2022 was extremely busy. We've come through the pandemic and life is getting back to normal but there are still many issues affecting us daily.

The cost of living has skyrocketed, and inflation is affecting our every move. Where it really hits home is when I walk into a grocery store. The same pound of butter that used to cost \$3.99 is now \$7.99. New data released by Statistics Canada says food prices are rising at the fastest pace we've seen since 1991. Year over year prices have spiked by almost 10.8 percent!

Households now face the prospect of 15% of their income going to debt servicing alone. Mortgage interest costs for the average family are up 11%. Year over year that is the biggest increase since 1991. If someone renewed their

mortgage today, after having secured it five years ago, they would be paying about \$7,000 more per year for the very same house they lived in last year.

If people think home ownership is expensive, they should be careful about renting. That now costs \$2,000 a month in the average Canadian city. Vancouver has the world's third most inflated housing market. Toronto has the 10th. In fact, Vancouver is more expensive than New York, Singapore, London, England, and countless others of the world's most famous cities where they have more people, more money, and less land.

But there is hope. There is a better way. Government does not have to be so expensive. Our new leader Pierre Poilievre has some amazing new ideas on how we can curb overspending and get Canada back to being the best country in the world.

Why do we not cap government spending and cut waste and bring in a dollar-for-dollar law that requires the government to find a dollar of savings for every new dollar of spending measures? That would force politicians to make the same eitheror trade-offs when they're thinking about new government programs.

When a local mechanic decides he is going to spend a little more on advertising, he must spend a little less somewhere else to free up that money. When a family decides they are going to build a new porch, they might decide not to go on vacation or might try to find a bargain on both.

Politicians and bureaucrats do not make those kinds of calculations because they do not have to. There is always more in the pot. They can tax more, borrow more, or print more. I don't believe that we can go on this way. We can't keep borrowing or printing more money and expect things to get better.

We need to get back to spending within our means. We need to start thinking about running government the way small business owners and families run their shops and homes.

Never before have we had a government that has spent so much and achieved so little.

A government that has waged war on small businesses, while giving their Liberal friends

and family connections 100's of millions of your dollars for bogus schemes and programs.

Canadians deserve a government that unites and not divides. That protects our democracy and fights for our freedoms. Not one that continues to make life more unaffordable and punishing on those who chose to live in our rural, remote, and small towns.

A government that puts the safety and security of our communities first, not protect and make life easier on the criminals terrorizing them. A government who puts the rights and lives of victims first. Not out of hate for the criminals, but for our love of the victims.

One that provides more resources to those who protect our borders and communities, institutes stiffer penalties for prolific offenders. This is what I fight for each and every day.
