Lake hosted the Premier for a discussion, which tied into an announcement of Provincial funding for Massive Canada's construction of a new mass timber manufacturing facility at the former Jackpine mill site. We are pleased to see this investment in Williams Lake and look forward to seeing employment opportunities and economic benefits from this new operation.

The 95th Annual Williams Lake Stampede was an immense success again this year, and we were honoured to welcome Rick Hansen back to his hometown as honourary parade marshal. Dear Friends,

Another year is coming to a close. I hope you all had a great Thanksgiving and are looking forward to a wonderful Christmas season filled with family, friends, and joy.

As we approach the holidays, I've had the opportunity to reflect upon the highlights and challenges of the past year. While 2023 has certainly had its moments of positivity, the dayto-day hardships affecting British Columbians and all Canadians don't look to be going away anytime soon.

The cost of living issue that I wrote about last year has ballooned into a crisis. This crisis is hitting Canadians hard; whether at the grocery store, the gas pumps, or when you get your utility bill at the end of the month. Every Canadian who needs to drive, house themselves, or heat their homes is

feeling the pain of the Liberal-NDP government's reckless deficits, deficits which have led to a 40year high in inflation and have forced the Bank of Canada to increase interest rates 10 times in just 19 months.

What's more, the Parliamentary Budget Officer recently released a report which revealed that Canadians will be on the hook for 240 billion dollars over the next 5 years, just on fees to service our national debt. The same report detailed how Canada is on pace to rack up a 16% higher deficit than Finance Minister Chrystia Freeland promised earlier this year. Perhaps now it's becoming apparent to this Liberal-NDP government that budgets really don't balance themselves. One thing is clear: this cannot continue. Justin Trudeau is not worth the cost of a broken Canada.

The housing market is just as bad, if not worse. Mortgage costs for the average Canadian household have doubled in the 8 long years of this Prime Minister's tenure. In 2021, he encouraged people to buy homes because "interest rates are at a historic low". Less than 2 years later, thousands of Canadians are regretting listening to his out of touch advice, as Bank of Canada interest rates have increased by 1900% since he made those comments.

Recently, the National Post broke a story that details how even Canadian Forces personnel are leaving the ranks of our military due to lack of affordable housing. Brigadier-General Virginia Tattersall said that the "average cost to purchase or rent housing now exceeds incomes of several CAF working rank levels". I'm not sure there's anything more shameful than a government that can't even take care of the people who lay down their lives to defend Canada.

The situation is bad, yes, but it's not all doom and gloom. There is still hope for Canada; a pathway forward out of this tumultuous period

of irresponsible and ineffective governance. It's now been over a year since Pierre Poilievre took the reins of the Conservative Party, and under his leadership we are poised and ready to get Canada back on track.

For myself and the rest of Canada's Conservatives, affordability is our *number one priority*. From the seniors whose CPP payments aren't enough to afford groceries *and* rent, to the parents struggling to enroll their kids in sports while simultaneously trying to pay the utility bills, to the young Canadians whose dream of home ownership is slipping away before their eyes — I hear you, and we will fight for you. Common Sense Conservatives are the *only* Party that promises to reduce spending, reduce inflation, reduce interest rates, and finally bring home a balanced budget. We believe we have a duty to spend within our means. I've said it before and I'll say it again; the government should be run like a small business,

not a circus.

My Conservative colleagues and I are committed to bringing home a government that unites Canadians, rather than dividing them. A government that commits to safer streets and healthier loved ones. A government that listens to the needs of Canadians and puts them first, rather than wasting billions of dollars on agenda-driven inflationary policies. 
Cariboo Art beat guided the class through an exclusive design specially created for this event. The design offered flexibility, so the participants were truly able to create a 'one of a kind' piece!
