



Dear Friends,

I last wrote to you at the end of December, as we gathered with friends and family to unwind and revel in the joy of the Christmas season.

At the time, I described the highlights and low points of 2023. Now, as we head towards the summer, there are many new developments that I'd like to share with you; some good, some not so good.

In good news, my Private Member's Bill, C-321, passed the House of Commons in February. It's now in the Senate before hopefully becoming law. If assented to, it will consider the assault of a first responder or healthcare professional an aggravating factor during criminal sentencing. This will be a strong deterrent to the violence and harassment that our frontline heroes face on a daily basis.

In 2024, I have also continued my work on the mental health file, meeting with organizations whose goals are to improve the mental wellbeing of Canadians, such as KidSport Canada, The Union of Safety and Justice Employees, the BC Nurses Union, the Concussion Legacy Foundation, End Homelessness Canada, the Paramedic Chiefs of Canada, the International Association of Firefighters, the Ontario Psychological Association, and many more.

In big news, our Conservative team was instrumental in pressuring the Eby government in BC, as well as Prime Minister Trudeau, to end their dangerous drug decriminalization experiment, which has wreaked havoc in British Columbian communities.

After a lot of work on our behalf exposing the severe flaws in BC's decriminalization experiment, Premier Eby finally capitulated and asked Ottawa to adjust the laws. Now, it is once again illegal to consume illegal drugs in public spaces like parks, playgrounds, beaches, and hospitals.

But really, it should never have come to this. BC's drug decriminalization catastrophe is shocking, yes, but it's not surprising. After 9 years of this NDP-Liberal government, policies like this are the new norm. If we've learned anything over the last 9 years, it's that Justin Trudeau and his NDP partners will always put ideology over good public policy. For our country to thrive again, that must stop.

To that end, I will continue the fight to restore common sense to Canada. In order to stop the bleeding, a new government is urgently needed in Ottawa. Conservatives will restore financial freedom to Canadian taxpayers and business owners by bringing fiscal responsibility back to the federal government. As a result, Canadians will bring home powerful paycheques once again. Only a Conservative government will Axe the Tax, Build the Homes, Fix the Budget, and Stop the Crime.





Addressing Provincial Concerns


This issue transcends regional boundaries,
